QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Have you applied for Special Fees in the past 3 years? If so, please detail the outcome of each attempt.

Yes we have and each time we have succeeded. In 2014 we received \$33,525, in 2015 we received \$29,790, in 2016 we received \$32775, in 2017 we received \$24,400.

If you applied for Special Fees last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?

Yes there is an increase. Details are fully explained in the downloaded spreadsheet. Essentially, we ran out of money in equipment, car/van rental, gas and had to request for more money from our reserves in funding application #18941. We are also trying to reach out to more people in the East San Jose community through radio advertisements in which the lowest pricing was ~\$650 (\$10/3x per weekday, for a month); documentation for this ad has been submitted through the Annual Grant documentation upload portal. The reason we want this ad is because we want to reach the Vietnamese community in East San Jose who are a vulnerable population in terms of healthcare. We also wanted to participate in the Vietnamese Festival to further reach out to community. This required an additional \$400 had to be pulled out of reserves in funding application #19064. We have also organized a Spring Banquet for undergrads, med students, physicians, residents, members of the Stanford community to celebrate the Cardinal Free Clinics and spread the word about what we do in order to get more support some time in the future for our clinics. For this banquet, an additional \$4,400 had to be pulled out of reserves in funding application #20153. These are all additions we want to include in the next Special Fee application.

The Mission of Cardinal Free Clinics is to provide culturally appropriate, high quality transitional medical care for an underserved patient population and to educate and empower a new generation of health care leaders to proactively address health disparities and improve access to care in their communities.

How do you plan to publicize your events/programs to the greater Stanford community? Have you registered with Events at Stanford?

We plan to advertise our events/program through Activities Fairs, mailing lists, information sessions.

Cardinal Free Clinics currently has \$35,566 in reserve and has always had this buffer in reserve. This is all that the FO is currently aware of.

What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?

The three largest items are Event Food, equipment, and transportation (gas, car/van rental). Event Food covers the cost of breakfast and lunch to all clinic volunteers (students and physicians) at each clinic day every Sunday from 9AM to 5PM (~50 volunteers per day and 52 Sunday clinics a year, so at \$7 per person for 104 meals per year totals \$36,000). Professional volunteers including physicians, residents and nurses spend their precious time off with the clinic; food improves volunteer recruitment and retention, builds community, education, mentorship, and sustains volunteers throughout the day. Event food will also cover snacks for training and professional development events to build volunteer's skills and team cohesiveness. Equipment is our next biggest cost as it is what allows us to provide the services we need to provide as a clinic. This includes medical supplies such as needles, blood collection tubes, tourniquets, thermometer covers, masks, gauze, cotton balls, exam room bed covers, band-aids, ultrasound gel, PPD solution, albuterol inhalers, cholesterol and glucose test strips, gloves, hand sanitizer, etc. for regularly clinic days and health screening events in the greater Bay Area community. Also, includes general supplies such as storage cabinets, carts, shelves, printers, hand sanitizers, sharps container, power strips, plastic cups for general clinic maintenance. Gas and car/van rentals allow for volunteers to be able to make it to clinic. Covers gas reimbursement for the 45 mi. round trip from campus to clinic or to community health awareness & screening events in San Jose. Drivers are required to take at least two other passengers in order to be reimbursed. Amount budgeted based on last year's annual grant for 48 Saturday clinic days/year. Make, model, and year of car may vary, since volunteers drive their own vehicles, but a flat reimbursement rate is applied regardless of car type

What is the average attendance at your events?

Both Arbor and Pacific Free Clinics hold separate weekly clinic days in which there are about 50 volunteers each week. Arbor and Pacific function all year around.

What events/programs does your group hold throughout the year for the Stanford Community?

Every week, undergraduates have the opportunity to shadow med students and doctors and the whole clinical process by volunteering at the clinics. This provides an enriching experience for those who are interested in pursuing a career in healthcare. Additionally, the clinics hold workshops during the year about how to best work with patients, and social events to create a community amongst people committed to increasing the access and equal quality of healthcare to everyone.

Why are you requesting Special Fees?

We are requesting Special Fees because that is the main and only source of our weekly operations including transportation for undergraduate volunteers to arrive at clinic, lunch and breakfast for our undergraduate volunteers, and medical equipment so that our volunteers can provide the needed care services that the Clinics advertise.

Breakfast consisting of fruit and coffee, is obtained by a coordinator prior to clinic hours and nominally capped at \$10 total (\$0.20/person). Clinic lunch consisting of sandwich food platters is obtained by a volunteer on the day of clinic and capped at \$140 (\$2.80/person). All prices have been negotiated down. Professional volunteers including physicians, residents and nurses spend their precious time off with the clinic; food improves volunteer recruitment and retention, builds community, education, mentorship, and sustains volunteers throughout the day. Event food will also cover snacks for training and professional development events to build volunteer's skills and team cohesiveness.</i></p>
