What events/programs does your group hold throughout the year for the Stanford community?	An incomplete list of our events includes: weekly Shabbat dinners, biweekly bagel brunches, four educational programs which meet weekly (currently Tikkun Olam, FroJew, SoJew, and JuJu for the different classes) to plan events and learn about Jewish values, regular Holiday celebrations and Special D's for Hannukah and other major holidays, regular speakers, and self-care sessions for finals.
What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?	Event food and supplies are the largest expense due to the vast amount of events we hold every single year, From our biweekly bagel brunches to weekly Shabbat dinners to regular Holidays and community service projects. Our second largest is travel expenses, as we spend a lot on weekly Uber rides and gas in order to buy supplies. We also intend to plan more domestic trips for the coming year to visit important Jewish sites. Our third largest is honoraria for speakers, as JSA hosts 3 or 4 speakers every single year to speak on Jewish issues to the Stanford campus.
Why are you requesting Annual Grants?	Our organization has large, predictable expenses due to our role as the main representatives of the Stanford Jewish undergraduate community. We organize educational and social events to build Jewish community on campus and spread Jewish values like Tikkun Olam.
If you applied for Annual Grants last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?	Yes, we are seeking an increase so that we can support more educational programming, including more speaker series and religious education.
